Course Objectives

This course aims to enhance students' English language skills in academic contexts, focusing on reading, writing, listening, and speaking. The lecture is designed to help students acquire the necessary language skills and strategies to effectively engage with and excel in academic tasks, assignments, research, and communication within the university setting. Students will read academic texts, listen to lectures, and write academic essays while analyzing authentic texts.

The course equips students with the language skills and academic competencies needed to thrive in a university environment, contribute effectively to their chosen fields of study, and succeed in their academic pursuits.

Course Learning Outcomes

Students who successfully complete this course are expected to...

- Comprehend, analyze, and produce complex academic texts
- Read academic articles, understand lectures, and participate in discussions related to their field of study
- Utilize different reading skills such as skimming and scanning
- Express their ideas coherently and with appropriate academic language
- Take notes and recognize main ideas
- Summarize and paraphrase using academic language
- Enhance writing skills for various academic genres
- Conduct academic research and reference academic sources
- Use academic language structures and vocabulary

Course Content

Each week, a reading text from the textbook *Skillful* 4 (3rd Ed.) will be covered while reading an authentic passage in which academic language is analyzed and from which writing tasks are developed.
